1 Introduction

Please find enclosed a Notice convening the Annual General Meeting (“AGM”) of Europa Oil & Gas (Holdings) plc (the “Company”) which will be held virtually in closed session on 28th January 2021 at 11 am.

Resolutions 1 to 7 are proposed as Ordinary Resolutions. This means that for each Resolution to be passed, more than half of the votes cast must be in favour of the Resolution. Resolutions 8 and 9 are proposed as Special Resolutions. This means that for these Resolutions to be passed, at least three quarters of the votes cast must be in favour of the Resolution.

Resolution 1 – Report and accounts

To receive and adopt the Annual Report and Accounts for the year ended 31 July 2020.

Resolution 2 – Reappointment of auditors

Resolution 2 relates to the reappointment of BDO LLP as the Company’s auditors to hold office until the next Annual General Meeting of the Company and to authorise the directors to set their remuneration.

Resolutions 3, 4, 5 and 6 – Reappointment of directors

These Resolutions concern, the appointment of Stephen Williams to the board of directors, the re-appointments of, Brian O’Cathain, Simon Oddie and William Ahlefeldt-Laurvig, who retire as directors and offer themselves for re-election as directors of the Company.

Resolution 9 grants the directors general authority to allot shares in the capital of the Company for cash on an entirely non-pre-emptive basis up to a maximum nominal value of £444,692, representing approximately 10% of the ISC as at 21st December 2020 (such amount to be reduced by the nominal amount of any equity securities allotted under Resolution 8).

3 Recommendation

Your directors believe that the proposals set out in this letter are in the best interests of the shareholders as a whole and are most likely to promote the success of the Company for the benefit of its members as a whole. The directors unanimously recommend that you vote in favour of the Resolutions as the directors propose to do in respect of their own holdings amounting to approximately 7.79% of the ordinary share capital of the Company as at the date of this letter.

The directors invite all shareholders to vote now using the proxy cards as there will be no traditional show of hands at the meeting.
